



ANNE-CATHERINE LORRAIN, Policy Advisor, European Parliament, BE

Anne-Catherine Lorrain is a lawyer and researcher in copyright and ICT law. Since 2015, she is **Policy Advisor in the Committee for Legal Affairs in the European Parliament, representing the Greens-EFA political group**. Her work mainly consists in drafting and negotiating amendments to legislative texts, notably on the copyright reform. In 2017, she was leading the negotiating team of the European Parliament during the inter-institutional negotiations on the European legislative package implementing the WIPO Marrakesh Treaty creating new copyright exceptions for the visually-impaired.

She was previously accredited parliamentary **assistant to Julia Reda**, Member of the European Parliament in the Greens-EFA group and member of the Pirate Party, focusing on the drafting of the 'Reda Report' on the implementation of the InfoSoc Directive.

She is co-founder of the **COMMUNIA** Association, an international non-for-profit organisation promoting the digital public domain (<http://www.communia-association.org>).

She was a fellow at the **CERDI** research institute (Université Paris Sud-11, France), where she started a PhD on the issue of territoriality in copyright law. She was a visiting scholar at the **Max Planck Institute for Innovation & Competition** (Munich, Germany).

She used to work as a legal advisor in the music industry at the French division of the **International Federation of the Phonographic Industry (IFPI)** in Paris (France), before representing the interests of consumers as the coordinator of the IP Policy Committee of the **Trans-Atlantic Consumer Dialogue (TACD)** in Brussels (Belgium) and Washington D.C. (US).
